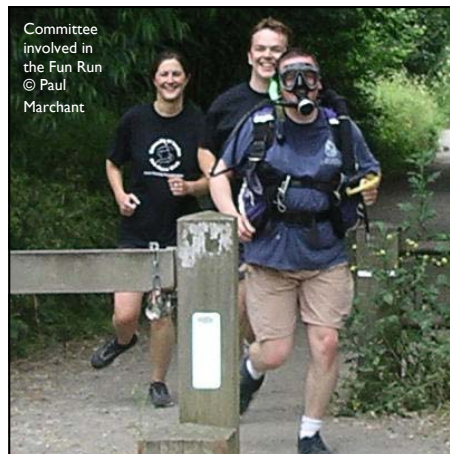
ULU Society Mentor of the Year (Awarded to the non-student who has given the greatest assistance and commitment to a ULU Society as an instructor, teacher or

Skill Development Courses

Fresh from teaching an Oxygen administration course I decided it was time to hone my rescue skills and broaden my first aid skills. With this noble quest in mind I decided to look into London region SDC's. I got talking to the club Wookie one evening and he decided that they sounded like a good idea so for the last two weekends of January and the first weekend of February myself and Nathan found ourselves in BSAC heaven! The courses we attended are:

23rd January First Aid for Divers (at imperial College) entry level 'Ocean Diver'

A revision of the resuscitation sequence and shock then straight into dressing wounds applying slings and improvising splints. A small amount of intimacy was involved in finding the brachial (and then femoral) pressure points and then improvisation (no not running around like some sort of lovey but how to fix people with what you might have handy on the boat).. Highlight of the day was carrying an instructor across the room using the stab jacket she was wearing and one wrapped around her legs (sorry Nathan, you rummaging around near my femoral pressure point came a close second...)

30th January Rescue First Aid (Harrow) (NB: Can't be Branch Run) entry level 'Sports Diver + O2 + First aid for Divers Course' Fixed cost of £37

This was an excellent course, highly recommend it (need to have done First Aid for Divers (hence previous weeks adventure). More slings and bandaging and then some new stuff; Bag mask resuscitators are an excellent way of providing high percentages of oxygen to a non breathing casualty, up to about 95% vs. 40% for a pocket mask, how to protect a casualties airway using Guedel Airways and how to fit a neck collar (although I'm not sure that's something I'd like to try and do because it's difficult to say the least)! Be warned there is an assessment at the end of the day! I'd urge

everyone in the club to give this course some serious consideration, the bag masks are a cracking piece of kit and it's a really good refresher of all the other first aid you've ever been taught.

5th/6th February Lifesaver (UeL Barking) entry level 'Ocean Diver'

Much more of a mixed bag this one, Saturday is a teaching day with an assessment (by different examiners) on Sunday. There's a dry session on CPR and also on some theory aspects followed by a pool session covering throwing ropes/buoys for casualties, how to approach a casualty, snorkelling rescue, swimming rescue and diver rescue (which has to be done in your suit). Again there was some new stuff on me (throwing and swimming rescues) and some revision (CBL's , AV) it was actually a very interesting exercise trying to do AV in a drysuit again, something I haven't practiced for a while and which had definitely deteriorated - perhaps a lesson for us all?

All of the courses have been really good fun and a real eye opener. You can't practice this kind of stuff enough. I'm hoping to work towards my approved instructor status and may look to start offering these courses in the club. One of the other really good things about the courses though is getting a non-club members perspective on things. Yes some of the stuff you'll hear is contradictory but a lot of it is real gold dust and it's only through mixing with other divers that new ideas are going to be brought into the club and best practice maintained. If anybody is interested in attending any of these courses one of the instructors we met would be happy to run a course for our branch. Please let me know if you'd like me to try and arrange it or get in touch if you have any questions
